are available at the DFG-funded Research Training Group 2844 "Staging Religious Atmosphere in Ancient Cultures" for a limited period of three years, subject to the approval of funds as of 01.11.2023. The position is graded according to pay group 13 of the collective bargaining agreement of the State of Hesse.

The Research Training Group 2844 investigates the "Staging of Religious Atmosphere in Ancient Cultures" on the basis of textual and material sources with interdisciplinary cooperation. This will offer the Ph.D. candidates unique opportunities to write a subject-oriented dissertation in an inspiring,

interdisciplinary and international environment and to build their own independent research profile. The Research Training Group will pursue a teaching and learning community that is open to new theoretical and methodological approaches as well as innovative presentation formats; the fellows will have extensive opportunities to participate in shaping this. Various training opportunities, including practical ones, will allow the candidates to develop their own academic profiles. We invite you to submit your own proposals for doctoral projects, which can come from the following eleven subjects: Ancient History, Old Testament, Ancient Oriental Studies, Christian Archaeology and Byzantine Art History, Greek Studies, Historical-Comparative Linguistics, Classical Archaeology, Latin Studies, New Testament, Law with a focus on Roman Law, and Religious Studies/History of Religion with a focus on early Islam.

Tasks:

- writing a dissertation in the subject area of the Research Training Group
- active in-person participation in the activities of the Research Training Group within the framework of the supervision and qualification programme

Within the scope of the assigned tasks, opportunity will be provided for independent academic research which contributes to the applicant's own academic qualification. The fixed term is in accordance with Section 2, Paragraph 1, Sentence 1 of the WissZeitVG.

Profile:

- completed academic degree (Master's degree, state examination or comparable) with above-average success in any of the the subjects: Ancient History, Ancient Near Eastern Studies, Christian Archaeology and Byzantine Art History, Classical Archaeology, Greek Studies, Historical-Comparative Linguistics, Latin Studies, Law, ideally with a focus on Roman Law, New Testament, Old Testament, and Religious Studies/History of Religion with a focus on Islam.
- ability to work in a team, determination and readiness for interdisciplinary cooperation

The willingness to pursue one's own academic qualification is expected.
